Since he joined the Beta Phi Chapter, Brother David A. McEvoy has been a Sigma Chi known for his commitment to the University of Arizona. His dedication ranges from outstanding senior man in 1979 through UA law school and alumni organizations.

McEvoy's presence has been felt as a member of Phi Beta Kappa and Bobcats as well as past president of the UA Alumni Association from 1993-94. Brother McEvoy skillfully helped the chapter with his pro bono law work with the new house building project in 2013.

Brother McEvoy was born on Oct. 3, 1957, in Oak Park, Illinois. He graduated from the UA in 1979 and enrolled in the law school, where he graduated in 1982. He practiced commercial law with a large law firm until Oct. 1 1992, when he became a co-founder of the firm McEvoy, Daniels & Darcy. He continues today as a representative of businesses and parties engaged in property and business transactions.

While practicing law, he has been special counsel of the Arizona Bar's disciplinary committees.

Other alumni participation includes past member of the UA Foundation, College of Public Health, past president of the Alumni Bobcats senior honorary, and member of the Student Union Advisory Committee.

Outside the UA, Brother McEvoy was a past member of the Arizona Theater Company Board of Trustees, past president of the St. Frances Cabrini Catholic Church Board of Directors, and past chair of the Diocese of Tucson Sexual Misconduct Review Board.

Among Brother McEvoy's honors was the Alumni Association Centennial Achievement award in 1998 and Distinguished Citizen award in 2001.

McEvoy's entry into Sigma Chi was unusual – he was a pledge, an active, and an alumnus in the same semester when the chapter went through recolonization. Sigma Chi means bonds of valuable friendship to him. Among his lifelong friends are his Beta Phi Sigma Chi brothers.

McEvoy has been married to Denise for 33 years, and they have five children. He treasures his family.
